Boracay Useful Information List

What To Bring You need very few clothes. Beach clothes/towels can be bought on the island. Sweatpants and tops are useful if you visit during Christmas as it can get cool at night.

Money *The currency* in the Philippines is the Peso (PhP) and the Centavo. 100 centavos = P1. Coin denominations are: 1, 5, 10, and 25 centavos, P1, and P5. Bill denominations are : 10, 20, 50, 100, 500 and 1, 000 pesos.

Take a mixture of American dollars in traveller's cheques and cash. Change some money at Manila International Airport where the rate is better than on Boracay. Credit cards are accepted in some locations on Boracay.

Traveller's cheques and cash can be changed at the Boracay Tourist Centre, the foreign exchange counter at the Allied Bank next to the Queen's Beach Resort in Angol, and the Boracay branch of the Allied Bank (tel: **2883026**). At the latter, you can open a peso or dollar account (minimum opening balance of P1000 or US\$200).

The Boracay Tourist Centre will give cash advances on popular credit cards (for a 7.5% fee). The Allied Bank will only accept American Express. Safety deposit boxes for valuables are available at the Tourist Centre too.

Extras You Must Not Forget Sunglasses, a hat, a flashlight and a good pair of beach sandals and your camera.

Business Hours Most businesses are open from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM weekdays and 8:00 AM till noon Saturdays.

Banks are open from 9:00 AM till 3:00 PM Mondays through Fridays. When banking in the Philippines, it is advisable to have your passport with you for identification.

The post offices are open from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM weekdays only. Stamps for postcards are frequently available from the concierge desk at most major hotels.

Language English is one of the official languages of the Philippines and there are no communication problems in English. If your mother tongue is not English, you may have some difficulties in listening to Filipino English because of their strong accent.

Long-distance Calls (national and international) can also be made from the Boracay Tourist Centre in Manggayad, where fax facilities are also available. In the meantime, several resorts have their own telephone and fax links. The area code for Boracay is **036**.

Health & Education For Medical Services there are a number of clinics on the island, e.g. The Boracay Medical Clinic tel: **288 3147** is open round the clock.

Tap Water on Boracay is not suitable for drinking at all. Nearly every store carries drinking water in plastic bottles, but be careful, make sure the seal hasn't been broken before you buy any! The best alternative is to have your own water bottle and to treat the water with iodine. This is 100% safe.
